## Rider in the Spotlight SARAH BETH LONGWORTH

- 1) How long have you been riding? How did you get started? I have been riding horses since I was 10 years old. A few of my friends from school were taking lessons, so naturally I wanted to, also. Ter-Ter called, set up an introductory lesson, and the rest is history. If Ter-Ter only knew then what she knows now!
- What is your favorite thing about riding and/or showing? Your least favorite thing?

I love the thrill, as well as the challenge that accompanies the thrill, that riding and showing brings. Not only do you have to hold yourself together and accomplish what needs to be done, but, in the meantime, you are also responsible for holding together a 1,000 pound animal who is depending on you, and you alone. It's a phenomenal feeling.

There is not much I do not like about showing, perhaps other than finding myself without a challenge ahead of me. In such cases, showing does not quite have the same appeal.

- 3) What division will you be competing in 2010? Magic and I will be competing in Amateur 5 Gaited and/or Ladies 5 Gaited. You never know with us...we like to keep things
